The Mental Health Technology Transfer (MHTTC) Network was a collaborative effort of 10 regional centers and a network coordinating office supported by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). The MHTTC Network provided support for resource development, training and technical assistance, and workforce development in the mental health field. The Northwest MHTTC supported HHS region 10 (Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, Washington) from 2018 to 2024.
